Within fifteen days after the chief judge of the First Judicial District has received the list of nominees to fill the vacancy, the district judges in Judicial Election District 1B shall, by majority vote, appoint one of those nominees to fill the vacancy.

Applications filed after the deadline will not be considered. The commissions discourage interviews with individual members. Letters of recommendation should, to the extent possible, be submitted with the application. Though information from the public regarding the qualifications of candidates is encouraged, applicants are asked to not flood the commissions with letters of recommendation or "mass lobbying" efforts. Quality of information is more important than quantity. The commissions will consider the following criteria in selection of nominees: integrity, professional skills, diligence and industry, judicial temperament, health and stamina, public service, decisiveness and ability to communicate.

A person does not qualify for appointment to the office of district associate judge unless the person is at the time of appointment a resident of either Black Hawk County or Grundy County, licensed to practice law in lowa, and will be able, measured by the person's age at the time of appointment, to com-plete the initial term of office prior to reaching age seventy-two. A district associate judge shall serve within the judicial district in which appointed, as directed by the chief judge, and is subject to reassignment un-der section 602.6108. No members of the commissions are eligible for the nomination to fill this position. To qualify for the position, a person must take and subscribe to the oath of office required by Iowa Code Section 63.6.
